1836

- ◆ Martin Van Buren of New York elected eighth president.
- ◆ First cook stove brought to Fort Wayne.
- ◆ Álamo captured by Gen. Antonio Lopez de Santa Anna. Nearly 200 Texans massacred.
- ◆ Legislature passed act to provide for general system of internal improvements.

1837

- ◆ Victoria becomes Queen of England after death of King William IV.
- ◆ Abolitionist Elijah Parish Lovejoy assassinated.
- ◆ Michigan admitted to the Union as the 26th state.
- ◆ Canadian rebellion at St. Denis, near Montreal.
- ◆ Financial panic in U.S.; panic did not end until 1843.

1838

- ◆ Steamer Moselle exploded on the Ohio River near Cincinnati; 100 people killed.
- ◆ Steamer Pulaski exploded off coast of North Carolina; 140 people killed.
- ◆ Pioneer William Rockhill began construction on the luxury hotel, Rockhill House.
- ◆ David Wallace becomes governor of Indiana.
- ◆ Terrible drought in Fort Wayne from July until Christmas.
