1847

- Flood does considerable damage in Fort Wayne
- Mexico surrenders; peace negotiations begin
- Postage stamps first received in the city
- Members of the Jacob and George Donner party found after being trapped by snow. Cannibalism was practiced for survival; 45 out of 87 people survived.
- Smithsonian Institution formally dedicated in Washington, D.C.

1848

- First telegraph dispatch sent between Fort Wayne and Toledo
- Wisconsin admitted as the 30th state
- Work started on Washington Monument at Washington, D.C.
- St. Mary's Catholic Church established
- Gold discovered near Sacramento, Calif.

- ◆ Treaty of Guadalupe Hidalgo signing ends war with Mexico
 ◆ Financial panic in Europe re-
- flected in the United States

- Boston Female Medical School opens as first medical school for women
