1855

- . End of Crimean War.
- Niagara River gorge suspension bridge, designed by John Roebling, opens.
- ◆ Benjamin Madden and George Keefer hanged for murder in Allen County.
 ◆ Construction of Wabash Railroad from
- Fort Wayne to Toledo.

 Photography first practiced in Fort Wayne.
- Robert Wilhelm von Bunsen invents burner.
- Point Loma lighthouse in San Diego is the first lighthouse built on the Pacific Coast.
- William Stewart becomes mayor of Fort Wayne.

1856

- · First national Republican convention held in Pittsburgh.
- Mrs. Carl Schurz opens the first kindergarten in Watertown, Wis.
- Canal bridge at Harrison Street collapses under weight of circus band wagon loaded with musicians; no fatalities.
- · Sir Henry Bessemer devises process for making steel.
- Legislature empowers "regulators" to capture criminals, and after a fair trial, to inflict punishment of death, if necessary.
- First Mississippi River railroad bridge opens from Rock Island, Ill., to Davenport, Iowa.
- · James Buchanan is elected president.
