Furious War Continues on Pacific Isles

10th Army Hammers Forward All Along Okinawa Battlefront

Dawn brought Victory-Day-in-Europe to the world today, but war clouds still darkened the Pacific where American and Allied forces scored new gains against the Japs.

Foreshadowing even greater blows to be unleashed against the Japanese in the future, now that their German partners have been knocked completely out of the war, the Japs were rocked by land, sea and air strikes.

In the furious battle for Okinawa's southern areas, powerful American warships of the Pacific fleet trained their long naval rifles on enemy strongpoints and helped break the stalemate existing along the Naha battlefield. Many pillboxes, blockhouses and other structures of the enemy's defense system above Naha City were destroyed by the U.S. battleships, cruisers and destroyers.

Added by Sea Bombardment
Assisted by this sea bombardment, troops of the U.S. 10th Army hammered their way toward an all sectors. Marines of the First Division recrossed Dakeshi village, which lies to the west of Bloody Hill 187, while 71st Division infantrymen employed flamethrowing tanks to advance to the center of the island. On the left bank, units of the famed Seventh Division had moved deeper into northern areas of the island.

First Adm. Chester W. Nimitz, in command, retires of the service fighter on Okinawa, said that the Tenth Army has slain at least 26,543 Japanese troops "in all areas of the land fighting" through Monday. The invasion of Okinawa got under way April 1—little more than five weeks ago.

Adm. Shima: Still Again

While the Japanese were riding the tanks in their assaults on the Naha line in Southern Okinawa, aircraft of Nimitz carriers again brought down shipping in the waters around Korea and Japan under attack.

Nine more enemy surface craft were sunk or damaged off Korea and in the south of the main island, two small islands being brought to 23. The total of enemy vessels announced as "destroyed or damaged" in two days in these regions.

Neutralizing attacks on Japanese airports in the Sakishima group of islands in the southwest of Okinawa also continued.

Tarzan Nearly Spies

The campaign to wrest the oil and rubber resources of the Dutch East Indies from the Japanese, with Gen. Douglas MacArthur commanding, has forced his command westward one-and-a-half miles of splitting the "spur" junctions side of Tarakan in two.
