BACKED BY CAMPBELL, HARTKE Alfred W. Moellering Said Slated for U.S. Attorney

By AL M. CAMPBELL (State Editor) The appointment of Alfred W. Moellering, Fort Wayne attorney and member of the Allen County Election Board, as Northern Indiana District Attorney appeared close to a certainty today.
