Rock 'N' Roll King Elvis Found Dead

MEMPHIS, Tenn. (AP) — Fans of yesterday and today, old and young, teenyboppers and their middle-aged mothers, gathered today on Elvis Presley's doorstep, not to scream and cheer but to mourn. Their king is dead.

Memphis Funeral Home where the body was taken after Presley died, said the casket was similar to the one the singer chose for his mother when she died in 1958.

He said the switchboard received calls from all 50 states and from as far away as Guam and Johannesburg, South Africa.

Lawyers Claim 'Sam' Insane

Police Security Tight as Berkowitz Faces First Hearing

NEW YORK — Lawyers for David Berkowitz, the accused "Son of Sam," plan to rely on a defense of insanity if their client ever goes on trial for the murder of Stacy Moskowitz, the last victim of the 44-caliber killer.

Berkowitz, who was indicted Monday in the Moskowitz attack July 31, still could be indicted on similar charges this week in the New York boroughs of the Bronx and Queens, the scenes of previous ambushes by the 44-caliber killer.

The defendant said little during the hearing, speaking only when asked. He seemed oblivious to the guards, reporters and, most of all, the growing number of bizarre and occasionally ludicrous facts of his case.

The family of Miss Moskowitz, meanwhile, filed a \$10 million lawsuit in Yonkers, N.Y., where Berkowitz lived, charging police there with negligence for failing to follow up "certain leads" that would have led sooner to his capture.

LAIGUEGLIA, Italy (AP) — Thor Heyerdahl, a 62-year-old Norwegian explorer who crossed the Pacific on a balsam raft and the Atlantic in a papyrus boat to demonstrate how ancient civilizations could have done it, is planning to sail the Indian Ocean in November on interlaced rushes.

NEW YORK (UPI) — The stock market drifted lower today. Traders sold in reaction to rising interest rates. Bargain hunters found some attractive prices among the glimmers. Trading was moderate.

Rain Inundates California

The remnants of dying tropical storm Doreen, "loaded with moisture," bore down on Los Angeles out of the Pacific Ocean today, throwing ahead waves of rain that flooded towns and cut roads in the desert, causing some evacuations and one death.

Imperial County, a desert farming region just east of San Diego and north of the Mexican border, was hardest hit. Some areas were evacuated and most highways were closed by flooding and washouts.

The main Interstate highway between Los Angeles and Las Vegas, Nev., closed by a washout and mudslide Monday, was partially reopened Tuesday, but another washout closed the main interstate highway to San Diego from the east.

U.S. District Judge Milton J. Pollack enjoined the Port Authority, which operates New York-area airports, from continuing its ban against the British and French supersonic jet.
