1902

- Allen County Courthouse dedicated.
- Army changes the color of its uniforms from blue to olive green.
- Pasadena, Calif., hosts the first postseason football game, the Tournament of Roses; later known as the Rose Bowl.
- Grabill is platted by Joseph Grabill, the town's first postmaster.
- Fort Wayne High and Manual Training School is built.
- ♦ West Baden Springs Hotel, dubbed the "Eighth Wonder of the World," opens in southern Indiana.
- · City residents Anthony and Joe Heit, Joe Miller

and Tom Lau start the Heit-Mi-Lau Candy Co. In 1930 the company changed its name to Wayne Candies, manufacturer of the Bun bar. 1903

- The Wright brothers, Wilbur and Orville, make the first successful airplane flight. The flight lasted 12 seconds and went a distance of 120 feet.
- Henry Ford establishes the Ford Motor Co.
- First World Series baseball game is played. The Boston Red Sox beat the Pittsburgh Pirates.
- The American Peony Society formed. The peony became Indiana's state flower in 1957.
