1926

- ◆ Henry Ford introduces the 40-hour work week.
- ◆ Construction begins on the Embassy Theatre.
- Fire Station No. 10 is built.
 U.S. Routes 24 and 66 are commissioned.
- ◆ Masonic Temple building is dedicated.
- ◆ The Southside Market opens.
- ◆ Fort Wayne pilot Art Smith is killed in a plane crash, while delivering airmail.
- ◆ New Columbia Street Bridge is built.

1927

◆ Mount Rushmore is dedicated.

- ◆ The musical, "Show Boat," opens at the Ziegfeld Theatre in New York City.
- ◆ North Side High School is built.
- ◆ Charles A. Lindbergh flies the first nonstop solo flight from New York to Paris in "The Spirit of St. Louis."
- ◆ Babe Ruth hits a home run when the New York Yankees play the Lincoln Lifers in an exhibition game.
- The first full-length talking motion picture, "The Jazz Singer," opens.
