MANILA, Dec. 8.—(A.P.)—The Japanese radio at Tokyo, Formosa, reported in a broadcast today that Japanese warships have surrounded Guam and laid all big buildings on the island under attack.

WASHINGTON, Dec. 8.—(U.P.)—The United States navy today reported that it had shot down a Japanese bomber over the Philippines.

WASHINGTON, Dec. 8.—(U.P.)—Federal agents arrested 74 Japanese aliens during the night in the United States and Hawaii.

BERLIN, Dec. 8.—(U.P.)—A Nazi military spokesman said tonight that Germany had abandoned attempts to capture Moscow.

NEW YORK, Dec. 8.—(U.P.)—The United Press tonight reported that Vichy broadcast Tokyo reports that a great sea battle was in progress off the Philippines coast.

NEW YORK, Dec. 8.—(U.P.)—The United States aircraft carrier Langley is reportedly reported in Manila to have been damaged during today's engagements with the Japanese.

LONDON, Dec. 8.—(U.P.)—The United States base at Guam was heavily bombed by Japanese dive-bombers today.

BANGKOK, Thailand, Dec. 8.—(A.P.)—Thailand, after brief resistance to Japanese invasion from the sea and across the French Indo-China border, ceased firing today and opened negotiations with the invaders.

TOKYO, Dec. 8.—(A.P.)—Army and navy sections of the Imperial headquarters announced today that 50 to 60 American planes were shot down in the Philippines.

NEW YORK, Dec. 8.—(U.P.)—The National Broadcasting Company's correspondent at Manila reported today that "Manila is now under Japanese bombardment."

MANILA, Dec. 8.—(U.P.)—Naval authorities announced today that the United States Marines of the Peppin and Tinian garnisons, isolated when Japan attacked the United States, had been captured by the Japanese.

SAN FRANCISCO, Dec. 8.—(U.P.)—The Singapore radio today reported that two American-built Hudson bombers operating off the Northern Malayan coast had scored direct hits on two Japanese troop ships.
