Huge Loss Of Life On Oahu As Result Of Jap Treachery

WASHINGTON, Dec. 8.—(U.P.)—Casualties on the Hawaiian island of Oahu in yesterday's Japanese air attack will amount to about 3,000, including about 1,500 fatalities, the White House announced today.

Gillie, Willis Would Strike Back At Japs

Congressman And Senator Abandon Traditional Stand To Support U. S. In War. WASHINGTON, Dec. 8.—Sen. Raymond Willis, of Indiana, and Cong. George W. Gillie, of the Fourth Indiana District, both Republicans, today abandoned their traditional stand against intervention in the European conflict, and declared for immediate support of the United States in war.

Official Text Of Congressional Declaration Of War Against Japan

WASHINGTON, Dec. 8.—(A.P.)—The text of the joint resolution adopted by Congress today declaring war on Japan follows: Declaring that a state of war exists between the Imperial Government of Japan and the Government and the people of the United States and making provisions to prosecute the same.
